Investment strategy

SKAGEN Vekst invests in companies that are attractively priced relative to expected profitability and growth. The majority of the fund is invested in the Nordic region and the remainder worldwide. The fund is suitable for investors with a minimum five-year investment horizon. Subscriptions are made in fund units and not directly in stocks or other securities. The benchmark reflects the fund's investment mandate. Since the fund is actively managed, the portfolio will deviate from the composition of the benchmark. Effective 01.01.2014, the fund's investment mandate changed from investing a minimum of 50% of its assets in Norway to investing a minimum of 50% of its assets in the Nordic countries. This means that returns prior to the change were achieved under different circumstances than they are today.

Monthly commentary, April 2023

Global stock markets generally posted positive returns in April as turmoil in the banking sector combined with recession fears were eclipsed by overall positive earnings numbers for the first quarter.

SKAGEN Vekst benefitted from the same factors and delivered a solid absolute return in-line with the overall market. For Norwegian-based investors, the return was amplified by a significant weakening of the currency. The Danish pharma giant Novo Nordisk was once again the largest positive contributor to the fund's absolute return in April. The company announced a material lift to its full-year guidance on the back of continued strong demand in its diabetes and obesity franchise. The announcement also demonstrates that management is confident that its supply challenges have been resolved, which has been a key concern for investors.

The Chinese online conglomerate Alibaba was among the largest detractors in April due to declining optimism around the reopening effects on the economy. We continue to believe China will see the same positive effects as we have seen in every other economy that has reopened after COVID lock-down measures. With its significant online retail exposure, Alibaba should be a key beneficiary of this. What makes this setup particularly interesting is the fact that the stock is currently priced as if the company had stopped growing.

We added to our position in the Korean telecom provider SK Telecom in April, as weak share price development has driven the valuation down to extremely attractive levels. To fund this, we sold our

remaining small position in the Norwegian oil and gas company Vår Energy. The company has not executed according to plan, and we find more attractive opportunities in our other oil and gas related companies. Seaway 7, which provides shipping services to the offshore wind industry, also left the portfolio last month. The company was successfully taken over by its parent company Subsea 7.

We believe the odds of sustainably higher inflation and higher interest rates have risen significantly over the past 18 months. While sanctions against Russia have increased the short-term pressure on commodities, we also see long-term second order effects through a reversal of the globalisation we have become accustomed to. We are therefore comfortable with our current exposure towards companies that do well in an environment with higher inflation and interest rates – such as financial and energy-related companies. We also see several emerging market stocks trading at very attractive levels following ten years of underperformance. This is particularly compelling as several Asian economies have not yet fully benefitted from the reopening in China.
